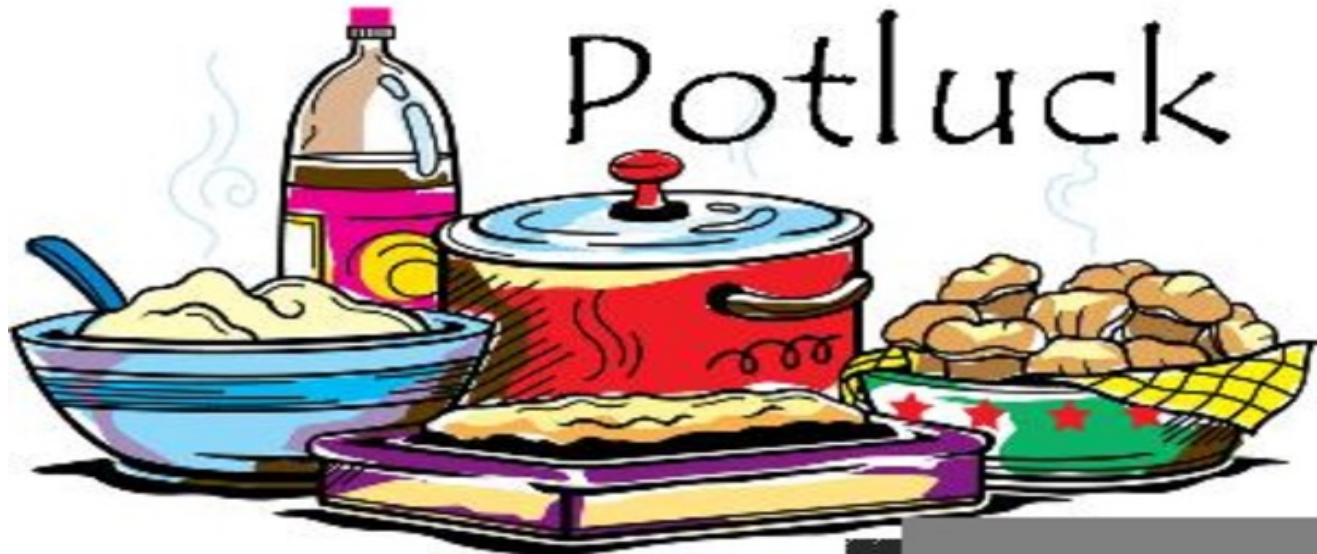
- Our Historian, photographer, block of the month organizer, Facebook guru and CCSA liaison, Lois Heath, is always busy with something.

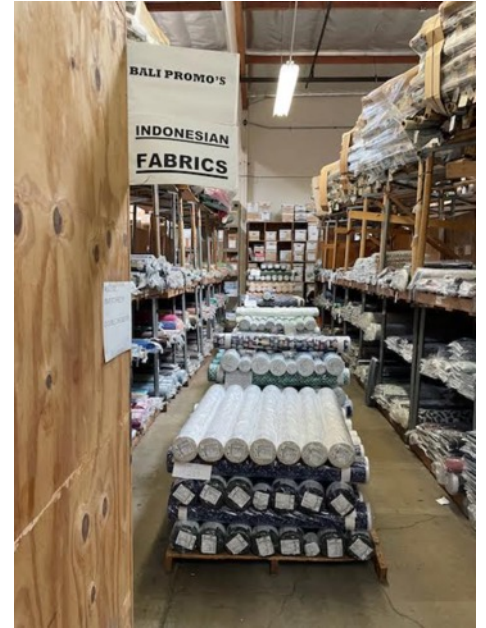

Block of the month



BOM Exchange:

Our June exchange marks the year-end. For the June BOM, the theme is Blue Plate Sandwich Special. In days gone by, the local diners and cafes would offer daily specials. In order to distinguish the orders, it became popular for the specials to be served on blue plates.

The BOM block is an artistic interpretation of the daily special. The blocks turned in should be 9.5 inches square. This block is very artistic in creation. The only two stipulations: the plate is blue; the background is white.

On the instructions, I have included some color representation ideas for your sandwich designs. Expand your brainwaves and think beyond to create your block. This should be really fun for all of the applique enthusiasts. Expanding the horizons, get creative with your interpretations. Read through all of the instructions and get you Van Gogh going (or whomever your muse may be). For added fun, if desired, include a title of the sandwich you created - either embroider or the perma-ink. If you have questions, give me a call or email. Stitchingly, Lois (who went way out of the box on this one!)



Block of the month



Build a sandwich in the center and add the sides.
 Here are just a few representation *examples* for the Luncheon Special!

Blocks should measure 9.5 inches when turned in.

BLUE PLATE SANDWICH SPECIAL

Let your imagination and creativity soar! **Enter a 9.5 inch block** and enjoy lunch!

Each block is unique so these instructions are intended for imagination and creativity. Beyond the simple Grilled Cheese, the instructions are not precise but depend upon the creator's innovation and ingenuity.

There are some sandwich and side examples at the end of these suggestions.

BLUE – Pieces at least 3.5 x 3.5 and scraps. See descriptions below for piecing / applique.

WHITE – Background – WOW, light cream or ecru. 6.5 x 3.5 (3 pieces) plus 2.5 x 2.5 charms (2 pieces)

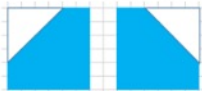
SANDWICH Colors – creator's choice. Here are some food representation suggestions:

- **Bread:** any hues within the ranges of: White, or yellow, or orange (light toast), or brown (toast). Add the **fillings** and accompaniments such as:
- **Greens:** Lettuce, spinach, bean sprouts, pickles, olives
- **Yellow:** Mustard, squash, cheese, fries
- **Reds and Pinks:** Tomato, catsup, beets, radishes, strawberries, preserves, ham
- **Browns:** Onion Rings, Fries, meats

Simple Grilled Cheese – Sandwich only, no sides

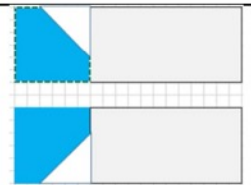
Start with a blue tone fabric as the plate for the serving of the sandwich.

PIECING: Blue 3.5 x 3.5 charms (3). One = center of the plate. The two plate sides are snowballed:



Using pieces of white background, Snowball two blue units with 2.0 or 2.5 inch charm (see layout for directional locations). Trim excess and press under the blue.

To finish the plate sides: Attach one of the 3.5 x 6.5 white background rectangles to each of the blue pieces on the now snowballed edge as shown in the diagram. (The diagram has been rotated for printing convenience.)



Now for the actual sandwich, create the sandwich in strips which are 3.5 inches:

Plate, bread, interior filling(s), bread (or open face canapé), and the background.

The actual sandwich can be made with 1.0 wide to 1.5 wide strips and it is completely the choice of the creator as to the width and color representation – refer to the example colors above for *ideas*.

The Simple Grilled Cheese strip collection:



This one uses pieces which are all: 3.5 x (see below)

Blue: 2.0 – the plate

Brown: 1.5 (twice) – the bread

Yellow: 2.5 – the cheese

White / Background: 4.0

Join the plate sides to each side of the “Sandwich” strip. **Trim** the block to be 9.5 x 9.5. Still hungry? Create another Blue Plate Sandwich special!

PLATE CORNERS Alternative: Use a drunkard's Path design for the rounding of the plate corners.

If appliqueing on top of the plate: suggestion is a blue piece 9.5 x 4.5 inches with snowballed corners of the background. Join the snowballed edge to a white background at 9.5 x 6.0. Once joined, trim the plate and background to 9.5 high. This will vary the plate height for additional interest.

We have received notice the prices of meals have increased \$4.00 per day starting with the spring retreat. That will increase our current prices \$36.00. The new prices are as follows:

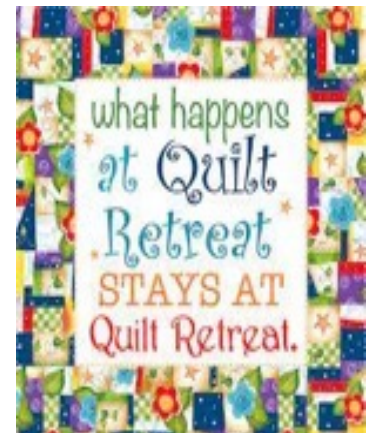
Double Occupancy - \$472.00/person

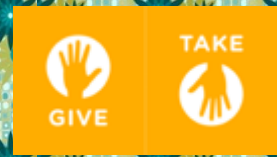

Bring your own projects or plan to work on a project shown by the MSQC team and buy your fabrics in Hamilton. There are plenty of stores and no shortage of fabric! And MSQC will ship your purchases home for you at the end of the retreat for FREE!

Jo's "San Diego Sewing with Friends" Retreat is planned for Tuesday – Friday, October 22-25, 2024.
