

Facing a Quilt is a method of finishing the edge of a quilt. A strip of facing fabric is sewn to the front of a quilt and turned to the back so that none of the facing fabric shows on the front. A Facing provides an alternative to traditional binding.

#### BINDING TIPS BY LINDA D.

I'll share my favorite tips for sewing the binding to your quilt. The goal is to have the binding the same width on both front and back. It's a matter of sewing with a seam allowance that works with the size of your binding and the thickness of your batting. My favorite method is to machine sew the binding to the back of the Linus quilt. Bring it over the front, securing it with a decorative stitch. This holds up well with the Linus children's quilts, which are dragged across the floor, bunched up while the kids are sleeping and washed frequently. How to turn the corner and my favorite method of joining the ends of binding will also be demonstrated.

Block of the Month (BOM)

Congratulations to Rebecca Johnson, winner of the April BOM Exchange blocks - 14 of them.


For MAY 2023: Every eventful meal starts with great appetizers and small bites. The most impressive starters include touches of the unexpected with a hearty base of the familiar. The block for exchange this month is basic black and white, but then adds a little touch of a surprise with random color corners. When the blocks get assembled there will be lots of whimsy on a black and white background. Instructions are attached as a separate file, and the pictures of the samples I made are included here! Have fun with this little bit of the unexpected. --Stitchingly, Lois.

BOM Teaser: Plan for a surprise with the block due in June - you will really get your creative juices going for it! Fortunately you will have an extra week between our May meeting and the June meeting. It's going to be really Special... (too bad you have to wait to know what fun I am having with my words! :): --Stitchingly, Lois





Directions will be attached to the email for ease of downloading



Notes: "Charms" are squares of the stated size; WOF=Width of Fabric; WOW=White on White The easiest method is to layout the pieces of the basic block and stitch the two center columns, then join them together. Add the exterior columns (WOW strips). Then add the snowball corners as per the final block diagram above. More detailed directions follow below.

 Make <u>two</u> center sections as follows: <u>Join</u> one 2.5 WOW charm to one black 2.5 charm. To the other side of the black, <u>join</u> one 2.5 x 4.5 WOW background piece. <u>Press</u> both seam allowances behind the black.

Tharm 2.5	Rectangle: 2.5 x 4.5

- Join the two units along the long side, flipping one end for end. The center seam should nest.
  Press the unit flat.
- Add the 2.5 x 8.5 WOW background strips to each side of the unit by joining along the side with the black edges. (The diagrams were rotated for pagination spacing.)

<u>**To Finish:**</u> Add **random** color 3.5 charm snowballs to the corners nearest the points of the black charms – refer to the diagram at the top. <u>**Draw**</u> a diagonal line on the back of the color fabric. <u>Stitch ON</u> the diagonal line. <u>**Trim**</u> and <u>**Press**</u>. (For bonus HST's, add a stich line 0.5 inch toward corner and cut between the two stitch lines.)

Yield: 1 block which currently measures 8.5 inches square.

The lucky winner will need 20 blocks (10 member entries) for a nice Linus Quilt Top (32x40 before borders).


## SUNNYSIDE CHICKEN QUILT SKILL BUILDING SMALL GROUP PROJECT
