

Block of the Month

Crossing Trails is the BOM which is due for the November drawing. The instructions are included in this newsletter and will be posted to the private Seaside Guild Facebook page in pdf format. Go to the files section to get this month, as well as the past months.

As with any instructions / recipe / directions: Remember to read through the instructions prior to beginning. Know where to go along the path before starting the engines!

If you have questions along the way, call me! I am usually within reach of the phone.

The Crossing Trails block in the final quilt top will give the appearance of being set on point (something most of us shy away from). Enter often and get a ticket for each block made. —Stitchingly, Lois

Buckeye By Clara Stone 1906


INGREDIENTS are 5-inch Charms (5in x 5in);

- 2 print Charms (Brown, Fall print) to create the buckeye center: use the same fabric
- 2 background Charms (White, or cream, or ecru, or yellow / tan tones)

<u>Notes</u>: There are several names for this block. Some references are Jacob's Ladder (which is a 9-patch – this is only a 4-patch), other variations depend upon the color usages and placements (points in or out; same color or scraps). The blocks use the same units and pieces; but the outcomes are very different. Of course, there are multiple methods of assembly for the two units. Have fun with the methods described below. BTW, buckeye seeds resemble edible chestnuts, but the Ohio Buckeye fruits are toxic!







The Block:

Possible final Layouts







Four Patch Units

With One Print 5.0 charm and One Background 5.0 charm, right (pretty) sides together, stitch 0.25 seams

on two parallel, opposing outside edges. **Open and press** to the dark (print).



Cut down the center of the block.





(across seams)

Rotate one of the two pieces and align the centers so the opposing fabrics align. **Nest** the center seams. **Join** the two pieces by stitching on the opposing outside edges (the two sides with the seams), as previously. **Cut** down the center of the block (parallel to the stitch lines and across the previous seams).

Open and press as the fabrics desire (sometimes one will be more gracious in bending backwards than the other).


It is optional to 'swirl' the seams making those adorable ultra tiny 4-patches on the back side! Swirling allows the centers to lay extra flat.

Square up (Trim) the units to 4.5 squares.

Yield: Two units of 4-patch trimmed to 4.5 each unit.

Half Square Triangles

Using the remaining two 5.0 charms right sides together, draw a diagonal on the back of the background (lighter). Stitch in both directions at 0.25 away from the diagonal line. Cut on the drawn diagonal. (If the Clearly Perfect Ruler is used, now is when the trimming occurs. Follow the ruler directions.) Open and press to the dark (print). Trim the two units to 4.5 squares.



Yield: Two units of HSTs trimmed to 4.5 each.

Final Assembly

Place the four units into the Block layout as shown. The dark squares of the 4-patch form a chain. The dark of the HST points inward. Join the columns. Open and press behind the Four Patch units. Join the Rows.

Open and Press the block. DONE!



YIELD: One block currently at 8.5 inches.

The winner can make a nice sized Project Linus quilt top with 24 blocks.

Make several and "eat your way" through the 5-inch charms (without getting ill).



2024 Shoebox Shuffle Quilt Challenge

Starts				

High Level: The object of the Shoebox Shuffle is to make a 12.5" quilt block out of the fabric in the box, then pass the box onto another quilter. You have 1 month to make the quilt block. The owner will make the 12_{th} block and finish the quilt. Organizer will create a sheet of participant names to add to the top of each box.

Final project: 12.5" blocks finish @ 12" → Creates a quilt 3 blocks across x 4 blocks down for a 36" x 48" quilt if no sashing or borders are added.

The Details:

- 1. Choose a shoebox or any container that will hold your fabric.
 - Attach list of participants on top of the box.
 - On same sheet, attach a small piece of your focus fabric and background fabric (optional if it will make a difference in your quilt design).
- 2. Fill the shoebox with any other fabrics that you would like to go in the blocks (any amount from fabric scraps, fat quarter, yardage, etc.).
 - · Place focus fabric in your Shoebox (at least a yard).
 - · Add optional background fabric.
 - · Pick other fabrics that you would like to be used in your quilt.
 - · Only the focus fabric must go in each block.
 - All fabrics do not have to go in each block.
 - If fabric is not in the shoebox, then it can't be used.
- 4. You have a month to work on each 12.5" block.
 - · Each block should have the focus fabric in the design.
 - · Use the background fabric if it's part of your block design.
 - No other fabrics are to be used except for what's in the box.
 - · Use any quilt pattern/design. Make it fun!
 - Blocks should be finished by the 1_{st} Tuesday of each month. It's ok to finish earlier, too!
- 5. When each block is completed, print your initials on the inside of a seam.
- 6. Place all scraps in a Ziploc™ bag and back into the shoebox. Add in your new block!
- 7. Date the sheet on the top of the Shoebox by your name.
 - Bring shoebox to our monthly meeting to pass onto another participant.
 - Repeat Steps 4-7.
 - If we don't get enough participants to make 11 blocks, then we will keep passing the box.
- 8. When 11 quilt blocks have been made, return shoebox to owner.
 - Shoebox owner will make their own 12th block with the leftover fabric.
 - The real challenge is putting all the blocks together to make your beautiful quilt.
 - There is no deadline (yet) in completing your own quilt. Have fun!

Thanks were given to Debbie Murbach and Patty Brown for arranging cake and ice-cream for the Seaside Quilters Guild Birthday celebration at the break.

A motion to accept the minutes of the June meeting passed. (Patti Brown/Donna Hoyle).

Andrea Mau and Barbie Lawrence announced the completion of the audit committee review of the prior year fiscal records. All was in order.

Joyce McCarthy will send cards to Ann Conn, Jean Smerdon and Bette Fischer.

Jo Vroman announced that programs for the year are on SQG Bookmarks. November the speaker will be Linda Ballard, followed the next day by a workshop "Pieces from the Past". The location of the workshop has changed to Tierrasanta Lutheran Church. The December sharing has changed to a 12-inch Miniature Wall Quilt. The Skill Builder project will be a Shoebox Shuffle. You provide fabric in a box and each month the box transfers to the next participant who completes a block. You will end up with 12 blocks. This project will begin in November.

The Fundraising committee announced the games organized by Ginny Pence (Bingo, Bunco and Left, Right, Center). Refreshments announced by Andrea Mau will include finger food and games food. If you would like to contribute it is appreciated. Phyllis Drewett needs one more person to help at the Buy it Now table and Vivian Simon volunteered. Gillian Moss announced \$20 tickets were available to purchase and will be sold at the door. Extra Bingo cards will be available for \$5. Donations to SQG are always appreciated, and please bring friends to the event in October.

Debbie Murbach reminded everyone to sign up for the Museum Bus Trip. Please get all newsletter articles to her by September 15.

Stevie Wheeler announced that the Opportunity of the Month is filled except for May and asked for a donor for that month to volunteer.

Linda Duggan announced that the Summer Sale raised \$1,065. Linus Quilt projects are available for pick up, and the next Linus Quilt meeting will be September 19. Linda needs help will all aspects of Linus Quilting. Please volunteer.

Rebecca Johnson announced that SCCQG is seeking guild entries for the Stitching a Community Together display at Road to California. Entries must be in by October 23. It was suggested that a quilt from the recent Chicken Quilt Project, or a Past President Quilt be entered.

Sally Stovall advised it is the last night to sign up for the retreat. 19 have signed up to date.

Judy Uyemura encouraged signups for the UFO group. There will be lots of prizes throughout the year.

Chris Bernet provided an overview of the new website **seasidequiltersguild.com** and encouraged members to use the online payment portal for dues and workshops.

Chris Bernet provided an overview of the Community Project. It will be a hanging quilt spelling out San Diego. Community workshops will be held in January, February, and March for the community to make "no stitch" blocks. An April SQG workshop will be for members to do final block preparation and in April and May the quilt will be put together. PR will be a key component to get the word out about our Guild, using photography at the events and articles. The quilt will be displayed at the Pacific Beach library in October and November 2024. In response to a request for items, Roni Cripps volunteered to donate Steam a Seam lite.

General announcements included Sewing Machine Plus in San Marcos opens at 9am Monday – Saturday. Jo Vroman has discount tickets available. It was also mentioned that quiltedtwins.com is a great website for free scrap quilt patterns.

Drawings were held for UFO, Opportunity of the Month and Door prizes.

The meeting was closed by President Sally Stovall at 8:20pm.
