JANUARY FOCUS ON COMMUNITY SERVICE BRING QUILTS FOR REFUGEENET

Why give a quilt to a



If you moved to a country with a completely different culture and language and perhaps without the skills to read or write, how would you cope with common daily events? How would you find housing, household items, transportation, medical care, schools, clothing, and food?

T-CALLER - COMMENT

A refugee is someone who has been forced to flee his or her country because of persecution, war, or violence. As of mid-2023 there were 36.4 million refugees in the world. The USA ranks 18th in the world for the number of refugees being resettled and San Diego is a major entry hub for refugees.

RefugeeNet is a small, local nonprofit responding to our world's worst humanitarian crisis: that of refugees. We help restore health, safety, education, and support towards financial stability and dignity to many refugees each year. Government programs can't cover all necessities for daily life. RefugeeNet helps fill in the gaps. Our clients are mostly families from Darfur, Congo, Sudan, South Sudan, Ukraine, Afghanistan, Iraq, China, Egypt, Haiti, Syria, Uganda, and Iran who arrive after extensive screening by the United Nations and the U.S. Government.

RefugeeNet serves over 165 families weekly with food supply. 30 students receive tutoring support. Caseworkers provide help with translation, transportation, connection to services and finding affordable housing and household furnishings. We try to help our refugee kids thrive through swimming classes, camping experiences, school supplies and STEM classes like Robotics.



A quilt is like giving a hug of welcome. Refugees come with little or nothing and often struggle to adapt. You have the power and the opportunity to share a welcoming, warm hug with our refugee families. For more information contact Seaside members Chris Winger, Mary Anderson or Sue Stevens. Bring your gently used, no longer used, and quilts you just don't like anymore to the January meeting. We will find them homes where they will be cherished, welcome our new neighbors and keep them warm.

Block of the Month

Square in Square Surround Please submit 4 blocks to count for one entry.

INGREDIENTS are <u>5-inch Charms</u> (5in x 5in);

1 Novelty print

2 background Charms - Lighter than Novelty (ANY Coordinating color; White, cream, pastels)



NOTES: It's a busy time of year, so the block is super simple and easy. There are at least ten methods to make this block. Please use this method so all blocks submitted are the same size!

Mise en place (Pulling it together / Preparations)

Fold the Novelty print (the center unit) in half along the straight edges in both directions. **Press** a crease in the edges to make reference marks at the center points of those edges. Or pin at crease, if preferred.

<u>Cut</u> the background 5.0 charms once in half on the *diagonal*. If the background fabric is directional, cut in opposing directions (place one horizontal and one vertical prior to slicing.) <u>Fold</u> the four pieces along the long edge to determine the center. <u>Press</u> a crease (or pin) in the edge as center reference mark.

Assembly = Round One:

With the right sides together, <u>align</u> center mark of one background triangle to one fold mark on the novelty fabric. <u>Pin</u> in place. Check alignment: the point of the triangle should eye-align with the opposing center fold mark on the novelty; the two triangle ends should 'hang over' in equal amounts. On the opposing side: <u>Repeat</u> alignment and pinning. <u>Stitch</u> the two triangles to the Novelty. Gently peel the triangles back and <u>press</u> flat. If the reference folds on the remaining sides are no longer visible, just repress them (fixed!).



Round One:

Assembly = Round Two:

Stitch the remaining two triangles onto the Novelty fabric in the same manner: Align, Pin, verify alignment, stitch, gently fold back, and press.

Use a square-up ruler and <u>Trim</u> to 7.5 inches. One block done! Repeat three more times in order to have one set for entry. A nice-sized Project Linus quilt top can be made with 40 blocks -10 participant entries!

Final Items: The finished block will appear to float due to the placement of the corner points.

--Once comfortable, no pins are necessary; great "eye-ballers" may find no center creasing is necessary.

--This method will work for ANY starter size. Two pieces for the outside "surround" and one for the center. It's also really fun to watch the block 'grow' as more and more rounds are added. A 2.5 center can easily become this 7.5 block.



TRAVEL TO HAMILTON FOR RETREAT OCTOBER 22-25, 2024





It is time to firm up your travel plans to travel to Hamilton for quilting fun with "San Diego Sewing with Friends Retreat" October 22-25, 2024. Registration for our "Sewing with Friends Retreat" will open in January 2024 and close March 2024 before it will be open to other interested quilters. We need 26 to keep the retreat just to our group. I have confirmed that the pricing given in June 2023 is still current

Retreat Date: October 22-25, 2024 with travel day October 21, 2024.

Retreat Fee: \$450 which includes dorm -style sleeping accommodation (2-5 per room and shared bathroom), 8 meals, coffee station, a sewing room with individual tables, as well as irons and cutting stations.

Sewing Machine: Babylock sewing machines are available at no additional cost when arranged at the time of reservation. So, you only bring your personal sewing supplies.

Early Check In: Available on Monday for an additional \$50 paid at time of arrival.

Travel Arrangements: Each participant is responsible for making their own travel arrangements. Flights from San Diego to Kansas City, Missouri. Transportation arrangements from the airport to Hamilton can be arranged or rental car options.

Accommodation: Rooms in the retreat center sleep between 3-5. No bunk beds. Six dormitory style bathrooms are on the second floor. Two handicapped rooms are available on the lower level with reservations by special arrangement.



Looking back on 2023, we celebrated the stories of survivors of Japanese internment camps, climate change, and motherhood. In *Interpretations 2023*, we presented contemporary 3D textile art from 37 artists around the world. We connected with young children via story time inspired by a fairy-tale quilt exhibit and through the artistic expression of 4th graders when they created self-portraits.

"When the kids see their quilt exhibited in the museum, their eyes light up with pride and their smiles are contagious." – Cabrillo Elementary School teacher.

We have big plans for 2024 with a new energetic staff eager to work with you—our donors, members, and textile enthusiasts—to celebrate the artistry and cultural significance of quilting and textile arts. Here are some of our upcoming programs that your donation helps support:

- Exhibitions by Eszter Bornemisza, Irene Roderick, Charlotte Bird, and *Tiny Pieces*, a group exhibit, will happen in the first quarter.
