

Block of the Month

SHOO FLY SQUEEZE





BLOCK OF THE MONTH: Congratulations to SALLY STOVALL, the winner of the January Blocks – Square in Square. There were so many entries, Sally's quilt top should be a nice queen size! If you have more blocks, please let her know so that she can plan her quilt top!

The block for the February turn in is the "Shoo Fly Squeeze". The instructions are included here as well as being posted to the Seaside Facebook page (see the separate "History" article within this newsletter). Start with 5-inch squares of blue, pink, neutral, and one 2.5 square as a Pop color. The adjusted 9-patch should come together in a jiffy. Call me if you have ANY questions on the pattern.

Shoo Fly Squeeze

INGREDIENTS are 5-inch Charms (5in x 5in)

2 Medium BLUE print charms (Stiles)

Cut and trimmed into 4 pieces 2.5 x 4.5

- 2 Dark PINK print charms (HST) (Pinks any dark hue / value / shade within the pink range)
- 2 Background LIGHT Charms (HST) (White, or cream, or pale yellow) These are corners.
- 1 POP square of 2.5 (High contrast to the others: bright red, black, deep and dark purple or blue)

NOTES: A true Shoo Fly block is a 9-patch of equally sized rows and columns. This is a "squeezed" version with the 'center' areas being half the dimension of the corners.









The Block:

Layouts:

Mise en place (Pulling it together / Preparations)

Center: If beginning with a 5.0 "pop" charm, cut in half both directions to obtain 4 pieces which are 2.5 squares. To be frugal, use all four "pop" pieces and make 4 blocks. This will require 8 each of the other ingredients. The Yield will be Four Blocks and four entries for chances to win.

Stiles (the center side spokes between the HSTs)- Medium BLUE - Preparation

For directional fabric: stack the two pieces in opposite orientation so one is horizontal and the other is vertical. <u>Cut</u> in half to yield four 2.5 x 5 pieces. <u>Trim</u> one end of each of these four pieces to obtain 2.5 x 4.5 logs. Listen to the chosen print, sometimes the print will prefer one end trimmed over the other. LOL

Half Square Triangles

Using 1 Dark PINK and 1 Background; place pieces right sides together, draw a diagonal on the back of the background (lighter). <u>Stitch</u> both sides of line at 0.25 away from line. <u>Cut</u> on the drawn diagonal. (If a Clearly Perfect Ruler is used, now is when the trimming occurs. Follow the ruler directions.) <u>Open and press</u> to the dark (pink). <u>Trim</u> the two units to 4.5 squares. (I use a Bloc-Loc ruler!)









Match

Yield: Two units of HSTs trimmed to 4.5 each.

Final Assembly

<u>Layout</u> the rows with the dark HST points facing inward. (Directional prints in stiles go same direction.)

<u>Join</u> the columns <u>pressing</u> towards the stiles; the center row will press 'outward' from the center; the top and bottom rows will press inward. <u>Join</u> the rows and press flat.

YIELD: One block currently at 8.5 inches. A nice sized Project Linus quilt top needs 24 blocks.








SIT AND SEW Every 2nd Monday



TRAVEL TO HAMILTON FOR RETREAT OCTOBER 22-25, 2024





It is time to firm up your travel plans to travel to Hamilton for quilting fun with "Seaside Sewing with Friends Retreat" October 22-25, 2024. Registration for our "Sewing with Friends Retreat" will open in January 2024 and close March 2024 before it will be open to other interested quilters. We need 26 to keep the retreat just to our group. I have confirmed that the pricing given in June 2023 is still current. The retreat information will be offered to other groups starting in January to hopefully fill our retreat.

Retreat Date: October 22-25, 2024. October 22, 2024 is check in day with first meal in the evening with open sew after. Early arrival is available for Monday October 21, 2024 for additional \$50.

Retreat Fee: \$450 which includes dorm -style sleeping accommodation (2-5 per room and shared bathroom), 8 meals, coffee station, a sewing room with individual tables, as well as irons and cutting stations.

Sewing Machine: Babylock sewing machines are available at no additional cost when arranged at the time of reservation. So, you only bring your personal sewing supplies.

Early Check In: Available on Monday for an additional \$50 paid at time of arrival.

Travel Arrangements: Each participant is responsible for making their own travel arrangements. Flights from San Diego to Kansas City, Missouri. Transportation arrangements from the airport to Hamilton can be arranged or rental car options.

Accommodation: Rooms in the retreat center sleep between 3-5. No bunk beds. Six dormitory style bathrooms are on the second floor. Two handicapped rooms are available on the lower level with reservations by special arrangement.

Fellow quilters, I want to share a thank you note from Project Linus San Diego Chapter Coordinator, Ursula Sorenson received from a local school. Ursula coordinated delivery of over 100 quilts to two different schools in the downtown area. Thank you to everyone at Seaside who helped contribute to this effort. It's heart warming to get such a nice note from the recipients

Dear Partners at Project Linus,

Thank you so much for the very generous donation of blankets for Horton Elementary students. You may not know that Horton Elementary is San Diego Unified School District's number one Title 1 ranked school in the district; 99% of our students qualify for free lunch and breakfast and we have a 42% population of homeless/foster youth (officially categorized as Youth in Transition under the federal McKinney Vento Act).

We were able to get the blankets into the hands of our students who are currently living in an unstable housing situation. Students were excited to pick out a blanket. And, because of your generous donation, we were able to give an additional blanket to a few of our students who are in exceptional need. Currently two of our students are living in a tent in a homeless encampment, and six others are living in cars. The blankets will definitely bring some additional warmth to some of the harsh living circumstances a few of our students are experiencing.

Again, thank you so much for the beautiful blankets. Your generosity is greatly appreciated.
