


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

HUMMINGBIRD DOUBLE STAR BLOCK




BOM: Congratulations to Rebecca Johnson who won the BOM blocks for March. Please let her know if you have blocks not turned in. The Exchange block for April is the Hummingbird Double Star. The beaks of the birds form the interior star with their bodies forming the outer (larger) star. The green leaves of the center red flower should be sewn ON the drawn Diagonal. Somehow, I missed that sentence. This block will also depend upon the correct colors (red, green, yellow, and a fuchsia or purple) These will be so much fun to see in a quilt top having matching color hues to blend the top. It was great to see the outcoming of February's winning blocks when Karen showed off her quilt top at the March meeting! If you have any questions about the block, give me a call! Hummingbird Double Star

Think of a hummingbird body with a yellow beak taking sips of the red center flower.





Found online - it's close:

Ingredients -	USE <mark>5-inch charms</mark> (<u>5in x 5in)</u> for all pieces
<u>Center</u>	1 Green charm – <u>Cut</u> into four 2.5 pieces – <u>draw</u> diagonal line on backs 1 Red charm – <u>trim</u> to 4.5 square
Birds	 Yellow -think of these as the bird's beaks. <u>Cut</u> into four 2.5 pieces and <u>draw</u> diagonal line on back of the yellow pieces Pink 5.0 charms (fuchsia, purple) - think of these as the bird's body. background (WOW (white on white) or Cream) 5.0 charms
Corners	4 background (WOW, Cream) charms $-$ <u>trim</u> to 4.5 square. These do not need to match the Bird backgrounds, but they do need to match each other.

Construction:

<u>CENTER</u> – Square in Square

Join one of the green squares to each of the sides of the red . First, Join green to opposing corners, <u>trim</u>, <u>press</u> open. Join the remaining two squares to the other corners, <u>trim</u>, <u>press</u> open.

OPTION: Get bonus triangles / HSTs by stitching 0.5 inch away from the original stitching and towards the open corner. Cut between the stitched lines and press open. Save for another project or turn in for the border.

SIDES - Star Points -

Part 1 = HST – using the pink / purple / fuchsia charm and a background , make HST units – two at a time.

Details: <u>Draw</u> a diagonal line on the back of two background charms. With right sides together, <u>Stitch</u> on both sides of the drawn line at 0.25 distance. <u>Cut</u> apart. <u>Press</u> open. <u>Trim</u> the units to 4.5 inch.

Yield is four (4) HST units at 4.5 inches.

<u>Part 2 = Star Point</u> (Beaks) – <u>Place the HSTs into the final layout</u> – watch the diagonal alignments to 'spin' in the same direction. Place the yellow pieces on the inside corners of the HST units. With right sides together, <u>align</u> one yellow piece to the corner of the HST. <u>Stitch on</u> the diagonal. <u>Trim</u> leaving 0.25 inch seam allowance. Yield is four (4) Star Point units at 4.5 inches.

OPTION: Get another set of bonus triangle HST units by stitching 0.5 inch away from the diagonal line and towards the corner. \underline{Cut} between the stitch lines. Enjoy the triple square triangle (TST) units!

FINAL ASSEMBLY


With the various units in the final layout (above picture), **join** the columns and rows as a 9-patch block. **Yield**: The block should now measure 12.5 inches square.

A nice sized Project Linus quilt top can be made with twelve (12) blocks.

The main problem is that I can't think of how I want to quilt the quilt, so it gets put on the back burner, sometimes for years if not decades!!! This year, I am trying to get my UFO's ready to quilt, meaning the top is pressed and excess threads are removed, the backing is made, and I've cut the batting to fit and made the sleeve (if using) and the binding. It's a lot easier to reach for the UFO to finish when It's all ready to go. I sure hope this new tactic helps me finish more UFO's this year. I'll be curious to see if any of you try this new tactic and if it helps to finish your UFO's. Let me know if it does!

By the way, I've been buying my batting from JoAnn Fabrics by the roll. It is often on sale. For instance, a 90 inch by 40 yd roll of Warm & White or Warm & Natural can be \$249.99 on sale and the regular price is \$459.99. I do like Quilter's Dream batting as well, but JoAnn's does not carry this brand. I try to buy this when it is on sale at Rosie's. If anyone knows of any other good deals on batting, please share with me and I will put it into the next newsletter.

TRAVEL TO HAMILTON FOR RETREAT OCTOBER 22-25, 2024

It is time to firm up your travel plans to travel to Hamilton for quilting fun with "Seaside Sewing with Friends Retreat" October 22-25, 2024. Registration for our "Sewing with Friends Retreat" opened in January 2024. Registration has been extended to May 2024 so there is still time to join your friends for a Hamilton adventure. After May the event will be opened to other interested quilters. We need 26 to keep the retreat just to our group. We currently have 19 registered so we still has space for our friends. Information is now being shared with other guilds and quilting friends.

Retreat Date: October 22-25, 2024. October 22, 2024, is check in day with first meal in the evening with open sew after. Early arrival is available for Monday October 21, 2024, for an additional \$50.

Retreat Fee: \$450 which includes dorm -style sleeping accommodation (2-5 per room and shared bathroom), 8 meals, coffee station, a sewing room with individual tables, as well as irons and cutting stations.

Sewing Machine: Babylock sewing machines are available at no additional cost when arranged at the time of reservation. So, you only bring your personal sewing supplies.

Early Check In: Available on Monday for an additional \$50. If you don't know your travel plans at the time of registration so didn't choose early check-in let Jo know and she can contact our MSQ contact to add early registration to your account.

Travel Arrangements: Each participant is responsible for making their own travel arrangements. Flights from San Diego to Kansas City, Missouri our currently open on Southwest. Transportation arrangements from the airport to Hamilton can be arranged or rental car options.

Accommodation: Rooms in the retreat center sleep between 3-5. No bunk beds. Six dormitory style bathrooms are on the second floor. Two handicapped rooms are available on the lower level with reservations by special arrangement.

Projects Presented by MSQ: If you don't have a project to work on during this retreat MSQ will be demonstrating two patterns that can be done during the retreat. The patterns presented will be Lakeview Terrace (jelly roll friendly) and Boardwalk (10" precut friendly). The fabric requirements are given at the time you register so you can bring your fabric with you OR of course you have time to shop before the retreat starts.

The meeting was called to order at 6:05 by Pres. Sally Stovall with 25 members, 2 new members (Gaye Larson and Livia Nelson), and 2 guests (Maureen Speck and Guest Speaker Nicodemus Linn from Refugee Net).

Barbie Lorentz filling in for the Treasurer Debbie Zeller reported total assets of \$29,985.00.

Corresponding Secretary Joyce McCarthy sent cards to Loretta, Bette Fischer, Birgit Limmer, Stevie Wheeler and Marny Leondis. Ione Skaar is happily home from Rehab and not ready for visitors yet but would enjoy phone calls.

Program Chair Jo Vroman talked about the March Speaker Carolina Moore. Her topic will be "My Favorite Notions" and the Workshop a curved log cabin. Wendy Mattson in May will share "Black and White to Brilliant." The Shoebox Shuffle exchange will continue at Monday's Quilt Till You Wilt at the Tierrasanta Lutheran Church for those not at this meeting because of the bad weather. She also reported on the trip to Missouri Star in Hamilton Missouri October 22 - 25, 2024 has 22 people interested, but so far only 7 women have paid.

Carol Simpson reported on the first of 3 workshops of the Community Quilt Project at the Pacific Beach Library and she showed the blocks made that day. The Committee was thrilled with the turnout and quality of those blocks. Some important things were learned and next month more people are expected with the great photos and article that appeared in the Pacific Beach Monthly paper and available online. The next dates are Feb. 17 and March 18 and hours are 1-3.

Lois Heath presented the March Block of the Month, Shamrock Flowers.

Hospitality Chair Cynthia Lyons-Dailard asked for someone to help set up refreshments and Julie Hasl volunteered.

Stevie Wheeler showed the Opportunity of the Month which is a Valentine Quilt by Mary Ann Moga and a Project Bag by Cindy Feagle.

Linda Duggan said Project Linus has 30 finished quilts so far and workshops will be Thursdays after Guild Meetings and on the 3rd Tuesday of the Month. The last Newsletter had a Thank-you from a School Principal for Linus Quilts given to needy students.

Sally Stovall distributed a signup sheet and deposit tracking sheets for the Retreats May 16-19 and Sept. 12-15.

SCCQG Representative Cynthia Lyons-Dailard described the latest online presentation on Cybersecurity for Guild Members. She will put a summary in the Newsletter and there will be a Hot Link for this topic of great importance.

Road to California Bus Trip was successful. Thanks to Jo Vroman for digitizing the Seaside Logo and making a quilt that was displayed there as was Donna Hogle's example of the Group Project Chicken Quilt.

Carol Simpson reminded that the "Quilt Back Challenge" is due in April.

Janice Faulstitch will be the Chit Chat coordinator.

New Business: A Nominating Committee will be needed to find the next President, Vice-President and Treasurer.

The Speaker, Nicodemus Linn, one of the "Lost Boys of Sudan" spoke about supporting Refugee Net and what it means to immigrants to have a warm welcome and concrete help to get established. He described terrible hardships his own group had experienced and the challenge of transitioning from a camp life to a modern society. We were in awe of his achievements and those of his companions.

Sally Stovall shared her experiences making Memory Bears from clothing for families of deceased Hospice Patients. She showed the bears also a sample Fidget Blanket which volunteers made for Nursing Homes.

Judy Uyemura's UFO Drawings were won by Despo Stevens, Jo Vroman and Sally Stovall.

Stevie Wheeler did the Opportunity Drawing which was won by Carol Simpson.

Lois Heath did the Block of the Month drawing won by Karen Zappone.

Door Prizes were won by Barbie Lorentz, Sue Stevens, Cynthia Lyons-Dailard and Loretta Ogden who celebrated her 99th birthday on Jan. 28. We all sang Happy Birthday to Loretta.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:45.
