





BANANA SPLIT BLOCK



Please submit <u>5 blocks</u> to count for one entry.

INGREDIENTS for ONE ENTRY: <u>5-inch Charms</u> (5in x 5in);

1 Yellow Charm– Bright yellow – distinctively Yellow; not too much orange / red 5 Print Charms – miscellaneous

Mise en place (Pulling it together / Preparations)

Cut the yellow charm into 5 pieces each at 1 x5 inches Cut the other five charms in half <u>one direction</u> for 2 piece of each print at 2.5 x 5 {Option: Begin with 2.5 strips cut into pairs at 5 inches.}




(shading to show CUT line – both sides are same fabric.)

Join one yellow strip to the center of the two pieces of print. **Press** the seams under the center yellow piece. The resultant block will be 5 inches square.



YIELD: The blocks will be 5 inch squares at this point. Five blocks will count as one entry.



A good sized Project Linus quilt will need 96 blocks - 8 x 12. This would mean 20 entries are needed.




PROJECT LINUS

Kits have been prepared for a super simple top. The All Boxed In pattern is published by the national Project Linus folks.

It is very easy to assemble with 5 inch squares and sashing. Please take a kit home to complete. My real need right now, as always is to have long armquilting done. If you are not a long armer, smaller quilts are great to practice your free motion. Please let me know if you can do these. I will bring a big box of blankets to the Guild meeting June 4. They are pin basted and ready for you're stitching. If you can't come to the Guild meeting or the Linus workshops, please let me know if I can drop some off to you.



Hope to see you on Thursday, June 6 for our workshop. After that, we will take a break for summer. Please let me know if you'd like to be added to my email reminder list. I'll be in touch a few days prior to each workshop. Thanks to everyone who continues to work on Linus throughout the year.

I know many of you (including myself) get stuck after making the top. You just can't think of a way to quilt the quilt, hence the surplus of unfinished tops. Here are some ideas to quilt your quilt if you decide to do it yourself versus hiring a longarmer to do it for you on the next page.

Hope some of these ideas help you get your quilt quilted! Rebecca and I have signed up to do another year of UFO Club and I'm going to work on a quilting idea handout with some of my favorite quilting ideas & motifs. This handout will be included with your UFO Club membership fee when you sign up in September. Until then, have a great summer and have fun finishing your UFO's!

Judy & Rebecca UFO Club Co-Chairs



1. Stitch in the Ditch (simple but pretty relaxing to sew in the ditch).

2. Cross hatch - this can be a big cross hatch or a small one. I like to mark the cross hatch because it tends to get wonky if I don't. However, if you have a Linus quilt with squares, you can diagonally cross hatch it without marking. Try using a wavy stitch which won't show imperfections as much.

3. Straight line quilting either vertical or horizontal or at an angle using a straight stitch or a wavy or decorative stitch.

4. Meander - there are all kinds of meander, the regular one but also you can add hearts, stars, circles, butterflies, etc. to your meander.

5. For longarmers, pantographs. There are zillions of Pantos out there!

6. Ruler work. There are rulers out there for both domestic machines and longarms. You can do circles, waves, ovals, clamshells, scallops, etc. with rulers.

7. There are tons of machine quilting books out there as well and classes both at quilt shows, quilt sewing machine/fabric shops, and online. Maybe try one to learn a new technique.

8. Keep a notebook with quilting ideas. When I see a cute quilting motif, I like to jot it down and then copy it into my quilting idea notebook later. Helps if you keep a small notepad with you when you go to shows or anywhere there are quilts on display, so you can draw it before you forget or else take a photo of it.

9. Perhaps it would be nice to hire a speaker/workshop instructor who will teach us some new machine quilting techniques.

10. Bring your top to guild or your small group if you don't know how to quilt it and ask for suggestions or ideas.

11. For longarmers, just load the quilt on the frame. Ideas will come when you realize you have to think of something because it's on the frame and you have other projects to do as well so you need to get it done and off the frame!

12. One last thing, look at the quilt top. Does it have a design you'd like to use for the quilting. There were butterflies on a recent quilt I longarmed and it gave me an idea to do a butterfly meander on the quilt.



TRAVEL TO HAMILTON FOR RETREAT OCTOBER 22-25, 2024

Retreat Date: October 22-25, 2024. October 22, 2024, is check in day with first meal in the evening with open sew after. Early arrival is available for Monday October 21, 2024, for an additional \$50 and if flying from San Diego you will need the early arrival to be able to make the orientation on Tuesday October 22, 2024.

Retreat Fee: \$450 which includes dorm -style sleeping accommodation (2-5 per room and shared bathroom), 8 meals, coffee station, a sewing room with individual tables, as well as irons and cutting stations.

Sewing Machine: Babylock sewing machines are available at no additional cost when arranged at the time of reservation. So, you only bring your personal sewing supplies.

Early Check In: Available on Monday for an additional \$50. If you don't know your travel plans at the time of registration so didn't choose early check-in let Jo know and she can contact our MSQ contact to add early registration to your account. If flying from San Diego you will need the early arrival to be able to make the orientation on Tuesday October 22, 2024.

Travel Arrangements: Each participant is responsible for making their own travel arrangements. Flights from San Diego to Kansas City, Missouri our currently open on Southwest. Transportation arrangements from the airport to Hamilton can be arranged or rental car options.

Accommodation: Rooms in the retreat center sleep between 3-5. No bunk beds. Six dormitory style bathrooms are on the second floor. Two handicapped rooms are available on the lower level with reservations by special arrangement.

Projects Presented by MSQ: If you don't have a project to work on during this retreat MSQ will be demonstrating two patterns that can be done during the retreat. The patterns presented will be Lakeview Terrace (jelly roll friendly) and Boardwalk (10" precut friendly). The fabric requirements are given at the time you register so you can bring your fabric with you OR of course you have time to shop before the retreat starts.
