The top and bottom rows of this quilt are based on the Choppy Flying Geese that I use in my Logo.

PROJECT LINUS SEPTEMBER 2024



As we get back to our regular Seaside Quilters meetings, I want to remind you that Project Linus is the focus of Guild's philanthropy. The Guild contributed 450 quilts in 2023!!! It doesn't have to fancy or intricate. You can make just a top with kid related fun fabric or do simple quilting on a blankie that has been pin basted by the group.

We need help with the binding or sewing on labels. All contributions are greatly appreciated. The quilts we make are for infants and teens and every age in between.

Some of the agencies that receive our quilts are: Rady Children's Hospital, the Autism Tree Project, Vista Hill Agency for the Betterment of Children, Our Mother of Confidence Church for Children in Need, Salvation Army Kids Day Care Program, Armed Forces YMCA Achievement Academy Day Program, Community Housing Works, and the Angel's Foster Family Network. Just to tug on your heart strings, the Angel's Network takes in young children, from newborns to 5 years old. The Police and Sheriff Departments refer these children because of neglect or abuse.

Works will be held at my home on the third Tuesday of every month from 10:30am to approximately 2pm. Bring your own lunch. Please let me know if you'd like to be added to my email reminder list. I'll be in touch a few days prior to each workshop.



The warmer months bring a greater need for hygiene items such as soaps, tooth care, shavers, anti-smell items, powder, lip gloss, and shampoo. Socks are constantly needed - no matter the weather. Pantry and shelf stable foods - especially if individually portions - are also good donation items. Check out the discount racks in the grocery store (typically found in the back or near produce); or specials at 'odd' food places (dollar stores, ethnic stores) ramen and dehydrated bowl meals are great shelf items. Seaside Quilt Guild - San Diego





There is still time to join the group traveling to Hamilton Missouri for the Seaside Sewing with Friends Retreat" October 22-25, 2024. Currently 22 will be making the journey.

A meet and greet will be held Sunday September 8, 2024 for the San Diego group.

Retreat Date: October 22-25, 2024. October 22, 2024, is check in day with first meal in the evening with open sew after. Early arrival is available for Monday October 21, 2024, for an additional \$50 and if flying from San Diego you will need the early arrival to be able to make the orientation on Tuesday October 22, 2024.

Retreat Fee: \$450 which includes dorm -style sleeping accommodation (2-5 per room and shared bathroom), 8 meals, coffee station, a sewing room with individual tables, as well as irons and cutting stations.

Sewing Machine: Babylock sewing machines are available at no additional cost when arranged at the time of reservation. So, you only bring your personal sewing supplies.

Early Check In: Available on Monday for an additional \$50. If you don't know your travel plans at the time of registration so didn't choose early check-in let Jo know and she can contact our MSQ contact to add early registration to your account. If flying from San Diego you will need the early arrival to be able to make the orientation on Tuesday October 22, 2024.

Travel Arrangements: Each participant is responsible for making their own travel arrangements. Flights from San Diego to Kansas City, Missouri our currently open on Southwest. Transportation arrangements from the airport to Hamilton can be arranged or rental car options.

Accommodation: Rooms in the retreat center sleep between 3-5. No bunk beds. Six dormitory style bathrooms are on the second floor. Two handicapped rooms are available on the lower level with reservations by special arrangement.

Projects Presented by MSQ: If you don't have a project to work on during this retreat MSQ will be demonstrating two patterns that can be done during the retreat. The patterns presented will be Lakeview Terrace (jelly roll friendly) and Boardwalk (10" precut friendly). The fabric requirements are given at the time you register so you can bring your fabric with you OR of course you have time to shop before the retreat starts.
