
#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE




Hi everyone!!



# BLOCK OF THE MONTH

#### **THANK YOU MARY ANDERSON!**

#### **BOM For February**

#### HAVE a HEART !!!



**Light** pieces **A**= 2 inch square, Cut four **B** = 6-inch Square, Cut one. **Red/pink C**= 5-inch Squares, Cut two. **D**=6-inch square, Cut one.



Figure 4 Trim to 5 inch square



Figure 3Make two half square triangle with the 6 inch blocks.Draw line corner to coner and stich ¼ inch form line. Cut on the line to make half square triangles



Place 2-inch squares on the upper corners of the 5-inch blocks and sew on the diagonal. Trim and flip.



#### **BLOCK OF THE MONTH**

**Sew** half square triangle together, Red to red. Sew red squares with flippy corners together.



Sew heart together. I found that pressing most seams open made for less bulky joining.


