

There are three ways to pay:


□ Mail a check to the Treasurer, Chris Winger, made out to Seaside Quilters Guild. Please date the check July 1 or later.



FOXY KITTY


Cut 3, 5-inch Fur colored squares. Cut 3, Neutral/light 5inch squares. Cut 1, fur colored 2-inch square.



This next step is a mirror image of the other. Draw a line on the light fabric from upper corner to 3.5 inches from same edge on the bottom. Put fur colored and light right sides together and stitch on the line.



Open up as shown and trim to 5-inch square. (Trim excess fabric after you trim to 5-inch square, 1/4 inch.)



Draw a diagonal line on fur colored 2inch square, place in corner of 3rd light square.

Sew just a needle width to the right of the line. Open and trim if needed. (Cut off excess fabric to one quarter inch.)






































































THANK YOU, LINDA

The "Dear Jane" quilt, made by Jane A. Stickle in 1863, is a renowned sampler quilt known for its 225 unique 4.5-inch blocks. Stickle, a Vermont schoolteacher, created the quilt during the Civil War, finishing in 1863. The quilt is celebrated for its intricate designs, unique fabrics, and the historical glimpse it offers into the 19th century.

This Small Group Is still in the planning phase! This flyer is to provide preliminary information to the guild and gauge guild member interest. More information will be discussed at the Sept. 2025 meeting, with a potential start in October.

Preliminary information (this may change):

- We will meet during "Quilt Till You Wilt" starting in October
 - We may meet on another day each month
- Focus will be on 6-10 blocks each month
 - Work at your own pace
 - Complete as many blocks as you want each month
- Approximate Fabric Yardage Suggestions (from the Dear Jane, (25th Anniversary) book by Brenda Papadakis):
 - 25 Fat Quarters of colored fabric
 - 8 yards of background fabric
- Sally, Roni, and Jo are discussing details surrounding the Dear Jane Book, patterns, templates, etc.

What you can do:

- Check out Dear Jane quilt pictures on Pinterest, Instagram, and Google
- Start thinking about:
 - Fabric and Color choices (multicolored, blue and white, brights, Amish, reproduction fabrics, etc.)
 - Layout options (Round the World, random block placement, etc.)
