# BLOCK OF THE MONTH For Sept. Meeting

**THANK YOU, MARY ANDERSON!**

**Step one** – Minimum of 17 inch long, 2.5-inch-wide Strips. One white, one black and two colors of your choice. (If you opt to use the width of fabric or jelly roll strips you can easily make two blocks.) Sew strips together with the black and the white strips on the outside. Press in one direction.



**Step two** – Cut in 8.25 widths and then cut on the diagonals.

**Step 3-** After cutting both blocks diagonally, sew together as shown in
