NOVEMBER MEETING ABOUT HEIDI PRIDEMORE



As the founder and lead designer of The Whimsical Workshop, I've spent over two decades creating bright, playful quilt designs that bring joy to makers of all levels. Our company was founded in 2005 after I launched my own line of quilt patterns in 2002, building on my earlier career as a product designer for craft companies. Since then, The Whimsical Workshop has grown into a vibrant hub for creative inspiration, known for colorful designs and easy-to-follow patterns.

At The Whimsical Workshop, my husband and I design hundreds of quilt patterns each year, along with hand embroidery and punch needle patterns. We collaborate closely with national fabric companies—including Blank Quilting, Henry Glass and Studio E—to create fabric collections, project sheets, and tutorials that celebrate color, whimsy, and imagination. As both an Aurifilosopher and BERNINA Ambassador, I love teaching others how to incorporate thread and texture into their projects in creative ways.

I'm especially passionate about using batiks, which I now design myself. I'm constantly inspired by the fabric collections we receive and love to create quilts that are either bold and geometric or delightfully whimsical. Whether I'm working on a new design or filming a tutorial for our YouTube channel, my goal is always the same: to spark creativity and make quilting approachable and fun.



Block of the Month (handing out in Sept and October, Due in November)

From the free section of Missouri Quilt website, block is by Kate Spain

For the ^{Large}rectangles, please use either provided fabric, or an olive toned fabric from your stash (can be light, medium or dark). Center square should be a bright fabric (a print is OK).

Assembly:

Making the Block:


9" x 9" finished size

Step 1. Prepare for block assembly by mixing and matching fabric prints to create block fabric sets. For each block fabric set gather the following:


- (1) 3½" print square. *Your choice - Bright color*
- (2) 1" x 3½" background rectangles. *white*
- (2) 1" x 4½" background rectangles. *white*
- (2) 3" x 4½" print rectangles and (2) matching 3" x 9½" print rectangles. — *Provided Green/olive*
- (4) 2" background squares. *white*









Step 2. Sew (1) $1" \times 3\frac{1}{2}"$ background rectangle onto either side of the $3\frac{1}{2}"$ print square. Press toward the print square.



Step 3. Sew (1) $1" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ background rectangle to the top and bottom of the $3\frac{1}{2}"$ print square. Press toward the print square. The block center should measure $4\frac{1}{2}" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ unfinished at this step.

Step 4. Sew (1) $3" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ print rectangle onto either side of the block center created in Steps 2-3. Press outward.



Step 5. Sew (1) $3" \times 9\frac{1}{2}"$ print rectangle onto the top and bottom of the block center. Press outward. The block should measure $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 9\frac{1}{2}"$ unfinished at this step.

Step 6. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (4) $2"$ background squares.

Step 7. Place (1) $2"$ background square onto each block corner, right sides together and edges aligned.



Step 8. Sew along the drawn diagonal lines as shown in the diagram.

Step 9. Trim the excess corner fabric to a $\frac{1}{4}$ " and press to the corner to complete the block. The completed block should measure $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished.

Step 10. Repeat to create (41) blocks using several different fabric combinations.

Just as a reminder this counts for a ticket in the drawing:

5. Kits! Many of us buy kits but never start them. If you have a kit, go ahead and finish it and it can be entered.



I hope that you will join Jo for Quilt til You Wilt the second Monday of each month. Join us at Tierrasanta Lutheran Church


11240 Clairemont Mesa Blvd, SD, from 10-3pm

7. Once you have the monthly list of blocks, you will need to get the block patterns. Below are two websites to get the block patterns. Choose the correct website for your size blocks:

If you are just starting your Dear Jane, you may want to use the Hobby Stash website, which has slightly larger blocks at 5 1/2" unfinished and 5" finished blocks.

If you started Dear Jane in the past and want to add to your blocks or if you want to stay with the original size blocks, use the Susan Gatewood website, which has the original sized blocks at 5" unfinished and 4 1/2" finished.

9. Judy U. recommends stay stitching close to the edge (about 1/8"), around the block after you make it to keep it from coming apart and fraying.
10. You can store your blocks in a container, or you can pin them to a design wall. If you don't want to tie up your design wall for years, you can use either batting or a plastic tablecloth with the fuzzy stuff on the backside. You'll have to pin them on to the batting or tablecloth (they don't hold that well). Judy U. recommends the tablecloth because it can easily be folded or rolled-up and the blocks stay put.
11. We expect to be discussing the blocks each month at Quilt Til You Wilt (QTYW). If you have questions or are stuck on a block, stop by QTYW or reach out to Roni, Sally, Jo or Judy. One of us should be able to help you.


