Our give away gift for this year is going to be name tags. There aren't many rules, and it should be a lot of fun to see the end results. There were many names exchanged at our November meeting, but if you could not attend and wish to participate, please contact Sally Stovall at sallysemm@mac.com or call 619-916-6628. We will get you a name.

Rules and suggestions:

1. Name badge should be no larger than 4 inches X 4 inches.
2. Name should be minimum of ½ inch in height.
3. Fastener can be pin (supplied) or magnet If recipient does not have pacemaker. It could also be on a lanyard.
4. Bring them to December meeting and they will be put up on a board.
5. I am going to add, please put your name on the back. This wasn't on the original hand out sheet.

Sources for ideas.

There are many suggestions that are free on the internet searching "Quilt Name Tags". The website "fandafabrics.com/ /?s=name+tag" has a tutorial on how to make a name tag if you need more instruction. The name doesn't need to be embroidered by machine. It can be as simple as writing the name with permanent marker., embroidering by hand, or using the alphabet from your sewing machine.





DEAR JANE QUILT BLOCK OF THE MONTH 2 YEAR PROJECT

STARTED IN OCTOBER 2025



Hi all-

As discussed at the recent QTYW, we will have a catch-up month for December, so no new blocks to complete. YAY!

Now that I am working on my blocks (yes, I got a late start), I have a couple of notes to share.

1. I am not adding the sashing shown in the Hobby Stash Patterns. That sashing does not make sense to me. I will add sashing later.
2. Without the sashing on each of my blocks, my unfinished blocks are finishing at 5 inches square.
3. In the Dear Jane book and the actual Dear Jane quilt, the border triangles have the background fabric on the outside edges, but at least one (if not more) of the Holly Stash triangle patterns show the print on the outside edge of the triangle with the background used in the middle pieces. Make sure you are putting your background and print fabrics in the locations that you want. I would hate for you to have to remake a triangle (Like I am doing).

Hello Quilting Friends...

I recently talked to the manager at Rosie's Calico Cupboard about the empty shelves, sharing my concern about them and what they represent. She first assured me that the shop is not closing, not going anywhere (which I didn't think was the case anyway). However, between the aftermath of COVID (restricted sales, hours, etc) and the increased minimum wage and the effects of tariffs on their price of doing business, Rosie's is really taking a hit. I told her that I understand that they need people to come in and spend money before they can increase stock (obviously!) and that we aren't coming in partly because of the low stock, but there's another reason, I think. Pretty much every conversation I have with friends about going to Rosie's is followed by, "But will they be open then?", referring to the shortened opening hours - so we have here the classic "chicken vs. egg" dilemma going on: they can't improve things until they have more customers, and customers don't go because they haven't improved these things.

So I'm writing to ask you to go to Rosie's, even though it takes some extra effort, just so we can improve things for everyone. Yes, we could go elsewhere or shop online, but nobody else gives me a permanent 25% discount on top quality fabric. And if her extensive philanthropic efforts are important to you, that gives another reason to support the store.
