

Hope to see you at the May meeting with your completed UFO's!

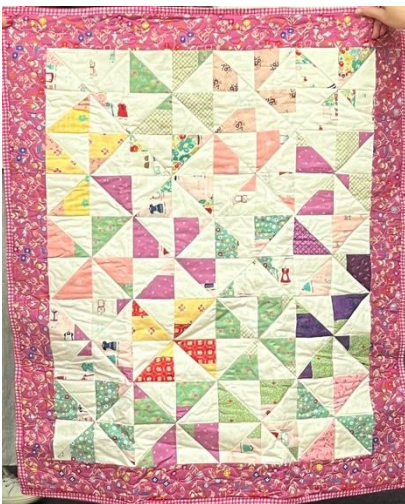
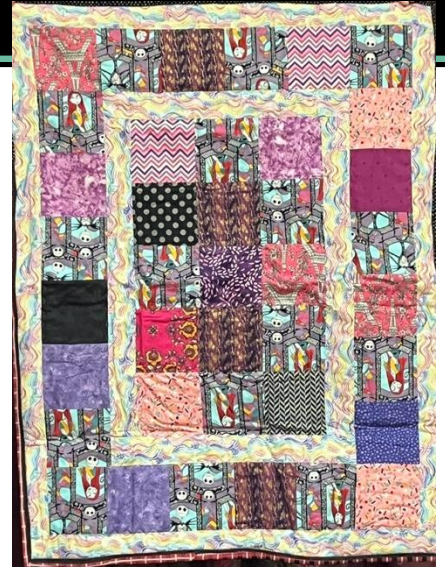

Use Only **two** different colored fabric. Please keep in **Blue** color palette.

One Light Fabric (white, Light blue , May have a design)

One dark or medium Fabric (please use a blue hue and a design is fine)

Light fabric cut :

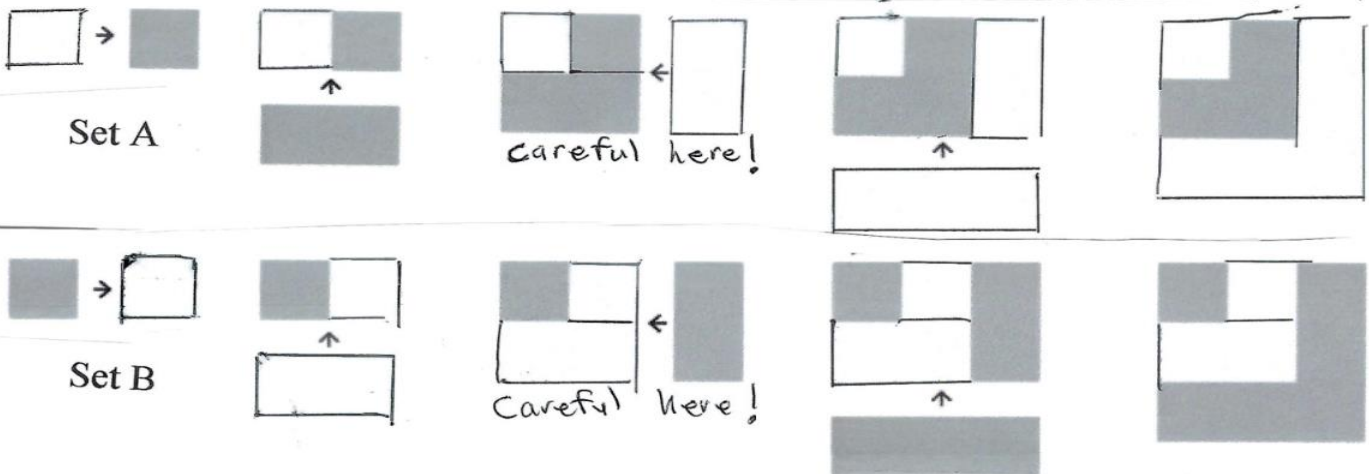
Four 2.5 squares, **Four** 2.5 by 4.5 rectangles and **Two** 2.5 by 6.5 rectangles

Dark or medium fabric cut:

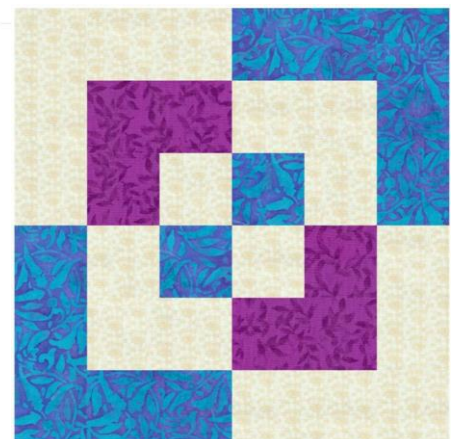
Four 2.5 squares, **Four** 2.5 by 4.5 rectangles and **Two** 2.5 by 6.5 rectangles

Assmble as per the picture. You will have a Set A and Set B (2 blocks of each) .

Sew those four squares Alternating A and B sets to get the BENTO Block



When you sew them together you'll get a bento box block:

DEAR JANE QUILT BLOCK OF THE MONTH 2 YEAR PROJECT

STARTED IN OCTOBER 2025



Hi all-

Now that I am working on my blocks (yes, I got a late start), I have a couple of notes to share.

1. I am not adding the sashing shown in the Hobby Stash Patterns. That sashing does not make sense to me. I will add sashing later.
2. Without the sashing on each of my blocks, my unfinished blocks are finishing at 5 inches square.
3. In the Dear Jane book and the actual Dear Jane quilt, the border triangles have the background fabric on the outside edges, but at least one if not more) of the Holly Stash triangle patterns show the print on the outside edge of the triangle with the background used in the middle pieces. Make sure you are putting your background and print fabrics in the locations that you want. I would hate for you to have to remake a triangle (Like I am doing).

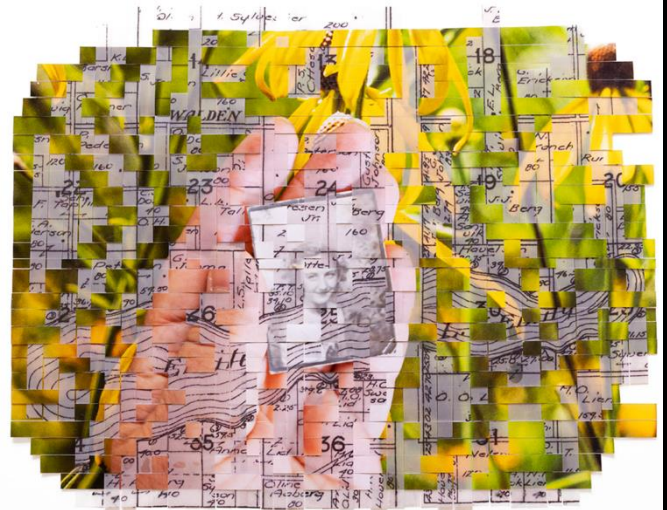
