PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

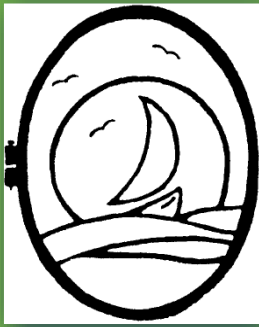
Hi fellow quilters,

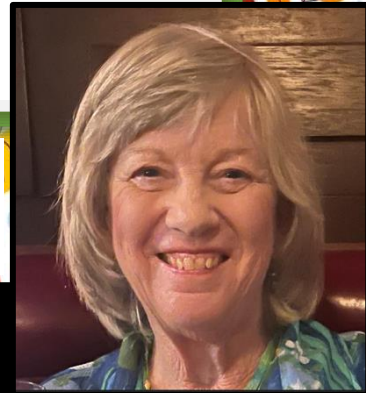

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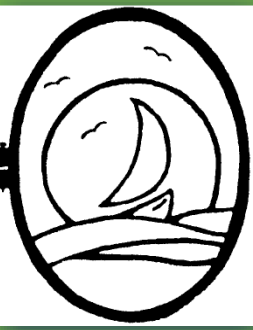


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

In this lecture Heidi will cover all things thread basics, including information on weight and ply, spool positioning, bobbin weights, needles and more. She will cover helpful tips and tricks to inspire and expand your use of Aurifil Threads on all your sewing projects. Each attendee will receive a small gift courtesy of Aurifil.

Heidi is known for her fun and whimsical quilts which she often makes in dramatic, bright colors. She also designs quilt patterns for a variety of popular quilting magazines. December 1, 2026: Holiday Potluck

January 5, 2027: Members A-L Trunk Show- Showcasing the Fiber art of our members. Members will share two of their quilts choosing from either their first quilt, their favorite quilt, their most traditional or artistic or favorite holiday quilt.

February 2-3, 2027: Program-Tina Curran “My Excellent Adventures as a Quilter”. In this lecture, Tina shows and shares the stories behind three dozen or so quilts she has made — most are her own designs.

SEASIDE PROGRAMS 2026-2027



Workshop: “California Poppies” This quilt is made using the paper-piecing technique. Though I made my composition with oranges & greens, my students have used a variety of colors to make their poppy quilts. Fee: \$65 non-member fee \$75

Supply List: 1-1/2 yards of background fabric (a mix of medium and dark green fabrics) • 1/2 yard of fabric for the poppy blooms (a mix of orange fabrics, but of course your poppies could be any color you wish) • 1/8 yard of fabric for the poppy stems (a mix of light green fabrics) • 3/4 yard of backing fabric • 3/8 yard of fabric for the binding • Piecing and quilting thread • Batting • Rotary cutter, ruler & mat • Sewing machine in good working order • “California Poppies” pattern • Add-a-quarter ruler (optional, to trim seam allowances neatly & with a consistent width) • Tweezers (optional, to help remove the foundation paper) You’ll need the pattern so that you will have the paper-piecing pattern pages on which we will sew during the class. The pattern is available in two formats – either as an instantly downloadable pdf or printed on paper and sent through the mail (with a shipping charge) – in Tina’s Shop on Etsy.com. You can find my shop on Etsy by using the URL www.tinacurran.etsy.com. With either version of the pattern, it is recommended that each student prints out a few copies of the pattern pieces for each of the three sizes of poppies before the workshop so that they are ready to go. Also, they should check the print test box on the pages as they print them to ensure the pages are printing out at the correct size on their printer.

Workshop: “Winter Village” Tablerunner: In this class you will be making a table runner based on this beautiful design. You will love creating charming house blocks in this fun and informative class. In this class you will learn tips for cutting, piecing, trimming, pressing and finishing touches for your quilts. Students will make a total of (3) houses in class and learn the techniques necessary to finish an entire village. This quilt is perfect in any color combination. Fee: Member \$75 Non-member \$90 Kit required for project includes fabric for table runner, binding, backing and pattern. (fabric may vary). **Kit Fee \$60 (payable in class)**

Hi everyone!

I am so excited to let you all know that I am the New UFO Club Chair. I am going to try to be as good at the job as Judy was but.....Those are some big shoes to fill!

The rules for 2026-2027 are going to be the same as they have been for a few years:

A UFO can be any Sewing, Quilting, Crocheting, art, craft etc. project that you started but that got put on the back burner for some reason and you didn't finish it. We are continuing to allow kits that you never started to be added to this list - of course, you have to finish them!! We also allow unfinished tops that you are donating to Project Linus to count. However, since quilting and binding a quilt often takes longer than finishing a top, the board has decided to count 3 (three) unfinished tops as one UFO entry. A maximum of three entries will be allowed per monthly drawing. Confused?? Here are some examples:

****You finished 3 quilts, crocheted a blanket and started and finished a kit. You are allowed the maximum of 3 entries in the drawing.**

****You finished 6 tops for Project Linus: you are allowed 2 entries in the drawing.**

****You finished 3 tops for Project Linus plus a knitted project and one quilt: You are allowed 3 entries in the drawing.**

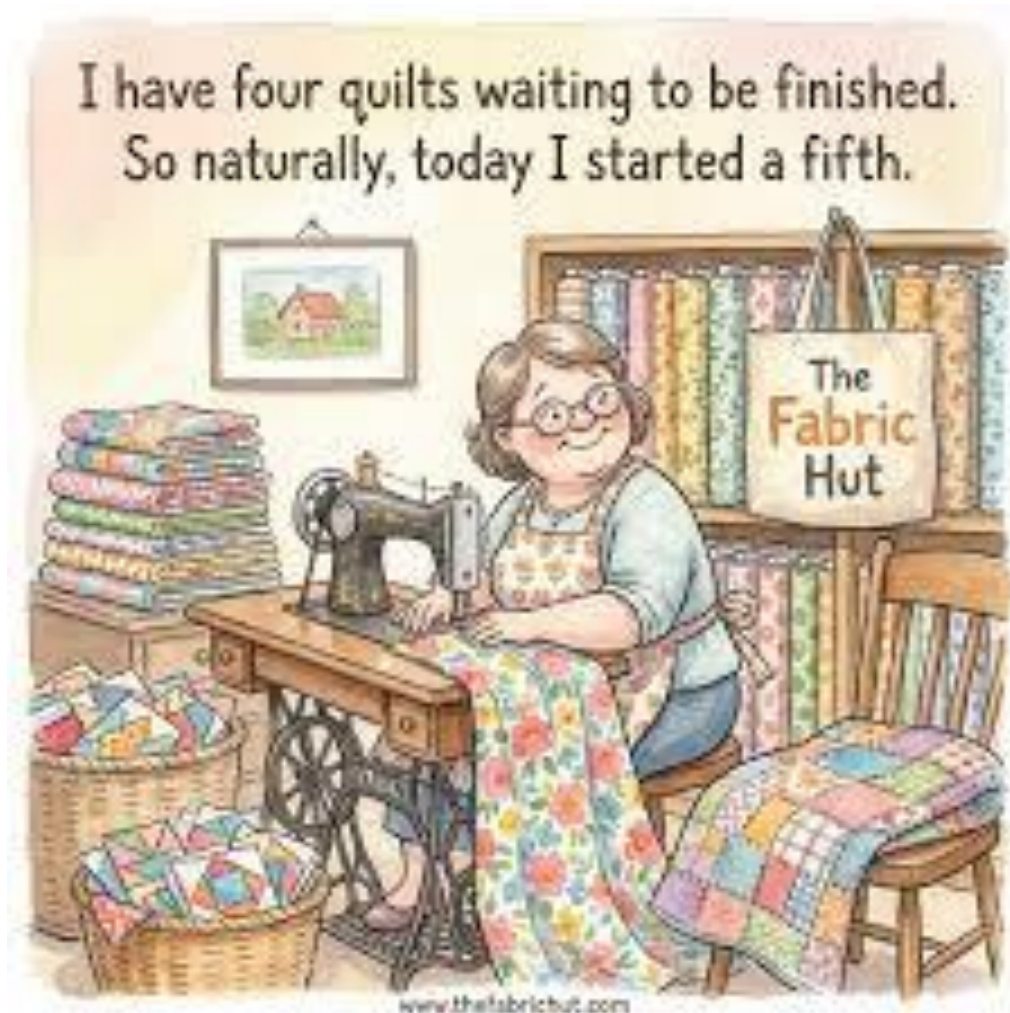


We will draw 3 winners each month: The first will win a Rosie's Gift certificate and the next 2 will win a little somethin', somethin'.

Orange Cranberry Scones

½ cup unsalted butter cut into small pieces and placed in freezer for 20 minutes minimum and 1 hour maximum.

2 cups all purpose flour

½ cup granulated sugar

1 ½ teaspoon baking powder

½ teaspoon kosher salt

½ cup heavy cream

2 teaspoon vanilla flavoring (extract works best, but imitation works too)

1 Orange zested

1 egg room temperature

1 cup dried cranberries

¼ cup heavy cream for brushing tops of scones

Sugar in the raw to sprinkle on top of scones before baking

First step is to get butter cut up and placed into freezer, next gather all your dry ingredients into your stand mixer bowl and mix until well incorporated. Next gather all wet ingredients into a separate container. Pull butter from freezer and mix into flour mixture (dry ingredients), if using stand mixer use the paddle attachment and mix on medium speed until butter/flour mix is crumbly. (the goal is to ensure majority of the butter pieces stay somewhat solid, it will help the scones retain the moisture). Now add in your wet ingredients, and mix on low speed for 10 seconds then add in cranberries, continue to mix until dough starts to pull away from bowl and come together. Turn off and prepare to scoop with ice cream scoop 2oz. scoop usually blue in color. Scoop them out onto sheet pan lined with parchment paper. Brush tops of scones with heavy cream and sprinkle sugar in raw on top and bake @ 400 degrees in conventional oven and @ 350 degrees in convection oven with fan on high. 20-25 minutes or until golden brown, rotate pan midway through the process for more even cooking. Enjoy 😊

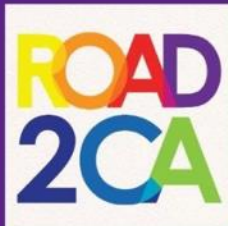
